

Combine's soccer program has grown exponentially in recent years, and the continued success, particularly this fall season, is a testament to both of the coaches' and players' ongoing determination for development and teamwork. Soccer is being highlighted this month for just that: the team's perseverance in tough competition and their eagerness to work collaboratively, knowing they will only be better because of those efforts. Many are unaware that the program competes in one of the largest men's semi-professional leagues (UPSL) in the country - in addition to three supplemental leagues. Earlier this season, the team won the Prep School League; they earned first place (Championship pictures above). They were then undefeated in the regular season of the College Development League and came in second place to Cocker University in the final match after the two teams challenged one another in a final round of penalty kicks. The team then concluded their season last weekend in two championship games. Even in the two UPSL divisions, despite the considerably intense level of play, Combine ranked 5th out of the 13 teams in the Premier division and went into their last regular season Division 1 game in 1st place. While the final games for Combine were tough, and there was definitely some heartbreak, the team proved their competitiveness and their drive to win throughout this season. There is no doubt that they will come back with vengeance this spring! Combine provides its athletes with exposure to varying levels (high school, collegiate, semi- professional). Regardless of the sport, students are constantly being challenged. However, together, these teams overcome, and the individual skills gained on and off the court will definitely aid them in their future endeavors. 








## **ATHLETIC UPDATES**
